Samantha Knupp, leader of Slices of Heaven and grade 11 Elkanah House High School pupil, describes how the project changed her view of social outreach, "I used to think outreach was very draining and tiresome but soon learned that giving back could also be very easy and doesn't take that much energy." The positive impact of the sandwiches does not just affect the students who are being served sandwiches; it also changes the Elkanah grade 7s as well. According to Samantha, one of the most rewarding parts of the project is "Watching the grade 7s mature as the year goes on. They start off very rowdy; they don't really care and a lot of them don't show up. But by the end of the year, they become lot more willing to help. They gain so much maturity and that's really amazing to see."

Thanks to a generous sponsorship of R250 worth of bread each week for the rest of 2017 from NXT\ Digital Innovation, Slices of Heaven is able to expand and serve 200 grade sixes at Zimasa Community School as well. This exciting expansion was kicked off on Monday, August 14 and is hopefully the start of a long partnership between Elkanah House and Zimasa Community School!
